God's Law ...

... in commandment
... in sacrifice
... and in priesthood.

"He said to them, 'How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory? And beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the scriptures concerning himself."

LUKE 24:25-27



THE LAW OF GOD

Law (Torah) = instruction and guidance for living and worship.

The Law was given by God through Moses to Israel soon after God had rescued Israel from captivity in Egypt (Exodus and Leviticus). Note the order! The Law was given to a redeemed people.

It was restated by Moses forty years later to the second generation of Israelites shortly before Moses' death and Israel's entry into the Promised Land (Deuteronomy).

The Law of God can be divided into three sections though there is some overlap.

Moral Law

The Ten Commandments (Ex. 20 and Deut. 5) The heart of God's Law. Spoken directly by God to the people. Written "by the finger of God" on two stone tablets. Stored inside the Ark of the Covenant in the Holy of Holies.

- a) **Our Duty to God.** To honour him in thought (1 and 2), word (3) and deed (4). (Commandment 5 should probably be included in this section)
- b) **Our Duty to Others.** To honour others in deed (6, 7, 8), word (9) and thought (10). To regard our neighbour's life (6), marriage (7), property (8) and reputation (9) as sacred.

Note Jesus' summary of the 10 commandments as love for God and love for neighbour.

Community Law

Instructions for living together as a nation and a community. Scattered throughout Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy. Some basic principles:

- a) Generosity to the underprivileged
- b) Equality and impartiality before the law.
- c) The sanctity of Life.
- d) High sexual standards.
- e) Punishments to fit the crime.

Ceremonial Law

Instructions for the formal worship of God. Included detailed provision for atonement and forgiveness. Second half of Exodus and a large part of Leviticus.

- a) The Place of worship. The Tabernacle (Exodus 35-40)
- b) The Priests. Uniform. (Ex. 39) Consecration (Lev. 8). Personal holiness (Lev. 21-22) Duties.
- c) The sacrifices and offerings (Lev. 1-7; 16-17; 22 etc.)
- d) The Feasts (Lev. 23 etc.)
- e) Cleanliness (Lev. 11-15 etc.)

Concluding observations

- a) God's lordship over the whole of life.
- b) The priority of obedience over ritual. "To obey is better than sacrifice."
- c) Christ's fulfilment of the Law.
